Technical Committee approves updates

At its meeting in San Diego, STI/SPFA's Shop Fab Technical Committee recommended, and the Board of Directors approved, three technical items:

- Recertification and warranty: "When tanks have a thirty-year warranty, tanks are not recertifiable twenty years after the date of manufacture. Tanks with a shorter w
 - the date of manufacture. <u>Tanks with a shorter warranty period than</u> <u>30 years are not re-certifiable past the point of the original warranty.</u>"
- Vertical tank dimensions: "The shell height of a vertical tank shall not be more than 50 feet (15.24m) and the <u>capacity</u> shall not exceed <u>60,000 gallons (189 kl)</u>. The minimum diameter of a vertical tank shall not be less than one-quarter of its height." This change reflects revisions to UL 142 and affects F921, Flameshield and Fireguard tanks.
- Using STI double bottom tank standard for App J tanks: "The primary tank (including pipe connections, manholes, etc.) shall be constructed in strict accordance with UL 58, UL 142, UL 80, ULC S602, <u>API 650 J</u> or the applicable tank standard..."

These changes will be communicated to STI licensees in a Technical Bulletin.


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Report released on 2012 US Economic Census



According to the National Association of Manufacturers, the "fabricated metal products" sector led manufacturing employment gains in 2013.

NAM's Manufacturing Economy Daily, a digest of media reports on various issues, reported April 11 that the economy is expected to accelerate in the second quarter:

The Wall Street Journal (4/11, Madigan, Subscription Publication) reports that according to economists it surveyed, the harsh winter that enveloped much of the country during the first quarter delayed a sharp acceleration of the national economy, which they now expect in the second quarter. Economists expect that the GDP will grow at a three percent annual rate in Q2, up from a 1.5% rate in Q1. The Q2 rate, according to the Journal's survey, would likely have been around 2.5%, but that is likely to be boosted as businesses and consumers look to make up for time lost during the winter months.

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California Phase I EVR compliance date extended

Compatible systems unavailable for some ASTs On March 13, 2014, the (California) Air

California Environmental Protection Agency

Resources Board (ARB) Executive Officer signed Executive Order (EO) G-70-216, extending the effective date for the installation of certified Phase I enhanced vapor recovery (EVR) systems at select existing aboveground storage tank (AST) facilities, due to the finding that compatible certified systems for certain AST configurations may not be commercially available.

Once a Phase I system is available that is certified compatible, these ASTs will have four years from the date of certification to comply as specified by regulations. Executive Order G-70-216 has been uploaded to the CA EPA's ARB <u>vapor recovery webpage</u>.

This Executive Order allows existing tanks that do not have the correct openings to accommodate Phase I equipment (i.e. do not have 4-inch top-fill or emergency vent) to operate without a

deadline.

The currently certified Phase I EVR systems require ASTs to meet the following configuration requirements:

- Gasoline must be received through a top-fill opening (direct or remote fill);
- The diameter of the product tank opening, or bung, must be at least four inches;
- A minimum of three bungs are required to accommodate the various Phase I EVR components;
- Or the tank must be equipped with an adequately sized bung for an emergency vent.

Public workshops to discuss proposed AST regulation changes On April 28, 2014, April 30, 2014, and May 1, 2014, the CA Air Resources Board will hold a workshop to discuss the Aboveground Storage Tank (AST) Enhanced Vapor Recovery Regulatory Advisory and Rulemaking Advisory issued on February 28, 2014, and proposed changes to the AST regulations.

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North Carolina: gasoline OK in small UL 142's

NC Fire Code Change on Gasoline ASTs for Motor Fuel Dispensing

According to an article in the April 16, 2014, North Carolina Petroleum & Convenience Marketers (NCPCM) newsletter, NCPCM has successfully worked with the NC Fire Code and NC Building Code committees to change the NC Fire Code as it pertains to fleet service stations dispensing motor gasolines.

NC Code Section 2206.2.3 specifies exceptions to the rule that "...Aboveground tanks shall not be used for the storage of Class I, II or IIIA liquid motor fuels except as provided by this section..." Four exceptions are noted, and a fifth has been added.

NEW SECTION effective March 1, 2014:

"5. Fleet service stations. Listed UL 142 above ground storage tanks with spill control, 1,100 gallons or less in capacity, may be used to store Class I liquids at fleet service stations."

NFPA 30 and 30A allow UL 142 listed tanks to dispense gasoline at fleet operations, although the International Fire Code does not.

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Comment on IAPMO greywater recycling standard

Comment deadline April 28th

IAPMO (International Association of Plumbing & Mechanical Officials) is promulgating a new standard BSR/IAPMO Z1207-201x, Small-Scale Residential Greywater Recycling Systems.



According to the <u>ANSI Standards Actions</u> document published March 14, 2014:

"This Standard covers greywater systems designed to handle greywater sources originating from single-family residential households with a maximum daily treatment capacity of 750 L/day (200 gpd) and intended for residential reuse for toilet flushing and subsurface irrigation, only, and specifies requirements for materials, physical characteristics, performance testing, and markings. This Standard does not cover rainwater systems or greywater treatment systems that incorporate biological or chemical oxidation for the purpose of reducing the BOD and TSS concentrations to secondary or better treated effluent water quality standards."

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Safety kicks off 2014 Annual Meeting

Jim Rhudy polls top five safety concerns

STI/SPFA safety consultant Jim Rhudy always opens the Annual Meeting with a "Safety Moment." In San Diego, he shared results of a poll he performed with Shop Fab Section members.



Jim asked them to name their top five shop fabrication safety problems, and 50% responded:

- 1. Material handling: rigging the load, use and care of rigging equipment (clamps and slings) and moving the load (proper use of overhead crane).
- 2. Fall protection.
- 3. Machine guarding (portable grindrs and bench grinders).
- 4. Personal protective equipment: wearing safety glasses (and face shields), gloves, hearing protection.
- 5. Housekeeping: cleaning up is part of the job, e.g. putting away equipment and assuring it is disconnected/turned off.

The Safety & Health Committee will be looking at these member concerns as they plan future programs.


